



Introducing the National Orthopaedic Alliance Improving quality in orthopaedic care

The National Orthopaedic Alliance (NOA) is an <u>acute care</u> <u>collaboration (ACC) vanguard</u> which will provide a framework for improving quality in orthopaedic care in England. It is a membership model founded on evidence-based descriptors of 'what good looks like' in orthopaedic provision.

What will the NOA deliver?

The NOA will create tools for providers and commissioners to enable them to consistently achieve quality and efficiency including a clear benchmarking system. It will develop flexible contracting mechanisms to ensure that commissioners can adopt the quality assured new model of care in different local health systems. The NOA will also be seeking opportunities to support other specialties in adopting similar quality based membership models to drive improvements in care.

Joining the NOA and achieving NOA quality standards will give members the tools and support they need to deliver improved:

- Clinical outcomes for patients
- Quality of life for patients
- Patient experience
- Patient confidence
- Operational efficiency
- Significant savings across the orthopaedic specialty

BSSH James Lind Alliance Priority Setting Partnership Common Conditions Affecting the Hand and the Wrist

BSOA has been approached by the British Society for Surgery of the Hand with a request to help in identifying unanswered questions about the management of hand and wrist conditions. The British Society for Surgery of the Hand (BSSH) along with the James Lind Alliance (JLA) are undertaking a survey of the questions that people with any experience of common conditions of the hand or wrist, and the health care professionals who treat them, consider important to be answered by research in the future.

Research topics are often decided by researchers, so they want to gather the views of patients, carers, family members and health and social care professionals to help to ensure that future research is aligned with what matters to those directly affected.



He was appointed as National Director for Clinical Quality and Efficiency for the NHS in September 2015 and has been asked to lead and roll out his GIRFT methodology, developed in orthopaedics, across all surgical and medical specialties within the provider network.
