Revised AAGBI Monitoring Guidelines

The AAGBI has revised their recommendations for standards of monitoring during anaesthesia and recovery, which replaces the previous guidelines published in 2007.

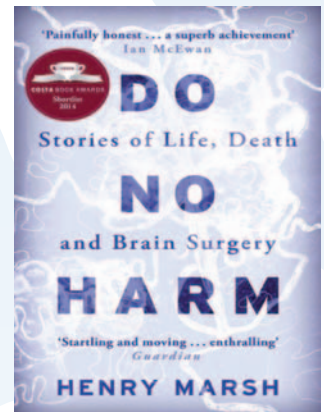
The aim of this document is to provide guidance on the minimum standards for physiological monitoring of any patient undergoing

anaesthesia or sedation under the care of an anaesthetist. The recommendations are primarily aimed at anaesthetists practicing in the United Kingdom and Ireland" (AAGBI, 2015).
